Structural steel specialist T T J wins \$34 million in new projects; Order book swells to \$181 million

- *New projects, which are estimated to be completed between FY2012 and FY2014, include work for the MRT Downtown Line 3; an 800MW power plant on Jurong Island and the National Art Gallery*

SINGAPORE - 19 October 2011 – T T J Holdings Limited (“T T J” or together with its subsidiaries, the “Group”) today announced that it has secured new contracts to supply structural steelworks and civil defence shelter doors totaling \$34 million, building its order book to date to \$181 million, up from \$147 million in mid-September 2011.

As part of the new contracts, T T J will supply and install civil defence shelter doors for the MRT Downtown Line 3. Says T T J’s Chairman and Managing Director, Mr Teo Hock Chwee (张福水): “I am very pleased to state that T T J has made strong and steady headway in cementing its leadership position in the provision of civil defence shelter doors. For one, we won the contracts to supply those doors for most of the 12 stations of the MRT Downtown Line 2. Now we have secured additional contracts for the MRT Downtown Line 3. Going forward, we plan to leverage our competitive edge in this niche to further grow this business.”

In addition to the above MRT Downtown Line 3 jobs, the Group was also engaged to supply and install similar doors for a major construction service provider in Singapore.

T T J was also awarded contracts to provide over 4,300 tons of structural steelwork for an 800MW Power Plant on Jurong Island and for the National Art Gallery. The power plant contract was awarded to T T J by its long-time customer, Samsung C&T

Corporation, one of the Engineering Procurement and Construction (“EPC”) contractors for the project. T T J’s scope of work is to supply, fabricate and install structural steelworks for buildings and piperacks in this development. For the National Art Gallery project, the Group was tasked by Beijing Jangho Curtain Wall Co., Ltd to design, supply, fabricate and install the roof and tree-like structures of this new iconic gallery which is located at the former Supreme Court and City Hall buildings. “Over the years, T T J has enjoyed a healthy level of repeat business from our customers. I believe that this is mainly attributable to the work quality we consistently deliver and the resulting confidence and trust that our customers have in us. Our commitment to quality is one attribute that we will always develop and hone,” said Mr Teo.

This latest slew of projects wins follows the Group’s recent set of strong financial results for the full year ended 31 July 2011 (FY2011) which was underpinned by robust growth in both its Structural Steel and Dormitory businesses. In FY2011, the Group’s net profit attributable to owners of the parent soared by 112% to \$14.4 million arising from a 39% surge in revenue to \$96.9 million. This compared with a profit and revenue of \$6.8 million and \$69.7 million respectively in FY2010.
